Motion by Vanness, seconded by Nolte to approve the 1st Reading of Ordi-

nance 2022A "Amending 6.1 "Zoning Regulations" and the Addition of Ordinance 6.1, Section 7 "Wind Energy Conversion Systems" for discussion purposes. The Board held extensive discussion and ultimately decided that there needed to be work done, details revisited, and some things added before proceeding. Supervisor McVicker called for the vote after discussion and the motion failed due to unanimous "Nays". The second public hearing will NOT occur on April 11th, instead the Board will continue to discuss and make changes to the proposed ordinance.

created between child welfare professionals, education, health, community- and faith-based organizations, businesses, law enforcement agencies, and families; and WHEREAS, communities must make every effort to promote programs and activities that create strong and thriving children and families; and WHEREAS, we acknowledge that we must work together as a community to increase awareness about child abuse and contribute to promote the social and emotional well-being of children and families in a safe, stable, and nurturing environment; and WHEREAS, prevention remains the best defense for our children and families. NOW, THEREFORE, we, the Franklin County Board of Supervisors, do hereby proclaim April as NATIONAL CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH in Franklin County and urge all citizens to recognize this month by dedicating ourselves to the task of improving the quality of life for all children and families.
