The Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 8:30 a.m., with Board members Michael Nolte-Chairman, Gary McVicker and Corey Eberling present. Chairman Nolte led the Pledge of Allegiance.
Motion by Eberling, seconded by McVicker, approves the Agenda as presented with the addition of a liquor license for Countryside Amish Furniture. All ayes. Motion carried.
Motion by McVicker, seconded by Eberling, approves the Minutes of Sept. 28, 2020. All ayes. Motion carried.
Committee Reports: Workforce Development; Franklin County Economic Development
Motion by McVicker, seconded by Eberling, approves a Franklin County Utility Permit Application for Franklin REC to cross 210th Street with overhead electric approximately 1,100 feet west of Tulip Avenue between Sections 28 and 33. All ayes, motion carried.
Lisa Mulford, Planning & Zoning, met to request a budget amendment for Department 64-CRC Building regarding the possibility to hire a cleaning company for \$1,100 a month for two hours each work day to help assist the County's Maintenance Department with the COVID-19 sanitizing. Also present was Ryan Peterson, Head Maintenance and Russell Wood.
The Board agreed to a one-year contract, adding a back out clause, and the understanding that through December expenses will be reimbursed through the CARES Act and after Jan. 1, 2020 this expense will be the County's to absorb.
